"The Vigil of Easter"

March 30, 2024

AS WE GATHER

Our journey following Jesus to the Cross has ended. Christ's Work on the Cross is finished. On this Holy Saturday, we wait, watch, and pray. Our attention this evening is focused on Jesus' Burial and coming Resurrection. We watch as Nicodemus and Joseph of Arimathea bury Jesus in a new Tomb. We see that Jesus' Words spoken to Nicodemus in John 3 are bearing fruit. Nicodemus has followed Jesus and is born again from above as a new creation. On this Easter Vigil, we remember our Baptism, and we remember when we were born again by Water and the Spirit and made Christ's new Creation.

The Easter Vigil "setting" is one of faith-filled anticipation. The Sanctuary lights are dimmed as the Congregation "recalls" the Actions and Promises of God in the Scriptures as we prepare for the joyful proclamation: Christ is Risen! Our Service begins in the Narthex with each worshipper receiving a candle to be lighted by the Christ Candle; and then our lights follow Christ' Light into Worship and into the world.

For the convenience of all worshipers at St. John, we have:

- Large-Print Bulletins and Hymnals
- A Quiet Room for families needing to take their child(ren) out of worship, located at the back (left side) of church, with a large window and speakers, so that families may still see and hear the Worship Service
- Restrooms located at the back of the Church in the Narthex
- Activity bags for children which are available in the Narthex, hanging on "Ginny the Giraffe". Children may take the pictures they color. Please return books, crayons and bags to "Ginny".

then traces the Greek letters Alpha and Omega on the candle while saying:

Pastor: the Alpha and the Omega.

He traces the year on the candle, saying:

Pastor: His are Time and Eternity; His are the Glory and Dominion, now and

forever.

He puts the five wax nails into the candle, saying:

Pastor: By His Wounds we have healing both now and forever. Amen.

Then, lighting the candle from the newly kindled fire, he says:

Pastor: May the Light of Christ, Who is Risen in Glory from the dead, scatter all the

darkness of our hearts and minds.

Pastor: Let us pray.

Almighty and most Merciful God, pour out on us Your abundant Blessing that all who in true faith share this night in joyful celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ from the dead may be filled with Your Heavenly Benediction. Once we were in darkness, but now we are in the

We know that Christ being Raised from the Dead will never die again: death no longer has dominion over Him. For the death He died He died to sin, once for all, but the life He lives He Lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Almighty and Eternal God, according to Your strict Judgment You condemned the unbelieving world through the flood, yet according to Your great Mercy You preserved believing Noah and his family, eight souls in all. Grant that we be kept safe and secure in the Holy Ark of the Christian Church, being separated from the multitude of unbelievers and serving Your Name at all times with a

fervent spirit and a joyful confidence, so that, with all believers in Your Promise, we would inherit Eternal Life; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.
