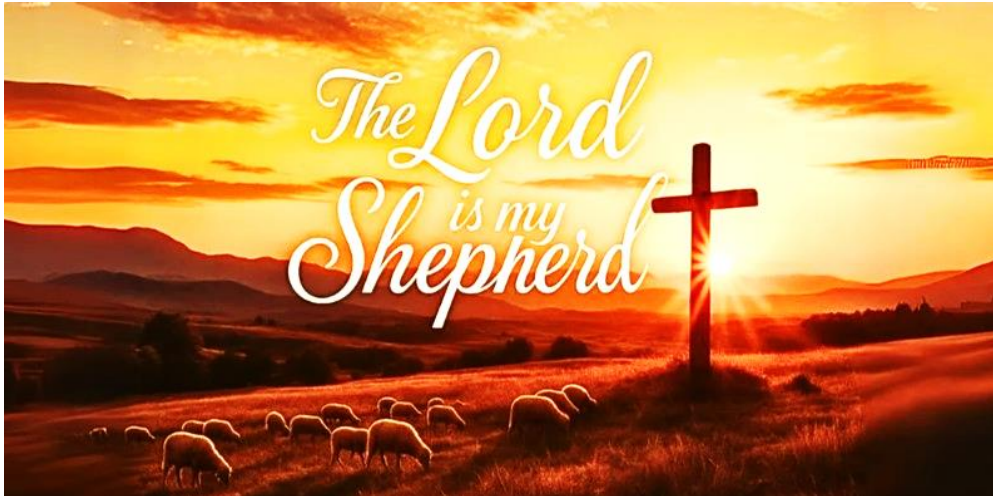

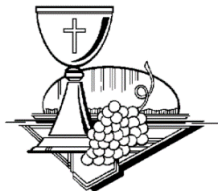
As you approach the Altar Rail, if you desire the Individual Cup of Wine, please take one with you.

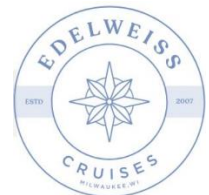
