The Harvest is the Close of the Age, and the reapers are Angels. ⁴⁰Just as the weeds are gathered and burned with fire, so will it be at the Close of the Age. ⁴¹The Son of Man will send His Angels, and they will gather out of His Kingdom all causes of sin and all law-breakers, ⁴²and throw them into the fiery furnace. In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. ⁴³Then the Righteous will shine like the sun in the Kingdom of their Father. He who has ears, let him hear.”
